Important Information

ACSI Student Leadership & Learning partners with K-12 schools and universities globally to advance the educational mission for students by providing enrichment and experiential events beyond the classroom, which equip students with valuable skills such as creative thinking, problem-solving, leadership, and service. Through participation, students discover their talents, reinforce their biblical worldview, and increase their cultural influence for Jesus.

NEW for 2023-24: There will be three levels of In-Person Spelling Bee competitions: Local, Divisional, and National. The top five (5) winners of the Spell-Off at each Local Spelling Bee competition will be invited to participate in a Divisional Spelling Bee. The top (5) winners from each Divisional Spelling Bee will be invited to the National Spelling Bee.

Schools that cannot participate in an In-Person Bee have the option to purchase a Spelling Bee Kit. If your school purchased a Kit, disregard the sections of this handbook that pertain only to In-Person Spelling Bees (e.g., participation fees and forms).

Submission of Fees

School registration fees are paid in the fall when submitting a registration form. Student participation fees are due 30 days before the event. The *Participation Fees Form* can be accessed online at **acsi.org/studentleadership** on the "Pay Fees" page.

To avoid a **Cancellation/No-Show Fee** of **\$200**, which covers your school's share of various event expenses, notify your chairperson and/or ACSI Student Leadership & Learning team member at least **60 days** before the event if you are unable to attend. Withdrawing within 60 days of the event takes away the opportunity for schools on the waitlist to participate and makes it increasingly difficult for the Chairperson to plan for the event.

Volunteers

Each participating school must provide five (5) adult volunteers to officiate at the ACSI Spelling Bee. Failure to meet this volunteer requirement will result in removal from the event. In such a case, school registration and student participation fees will still be assessed.

To protect students participating in an ACSI-sponsored Student Leadership & Learning event, the school administration must affirm that "All staff and volunteers the school provides meet its internal policies and standards and state requirements for working with children in a K–12 private school setting."

Insurance

All schools participating in an ACSI-sponsored event must have adequate insurance coverage for students and sponsors/teachers. ACSI does not assume responsibility for these coverages.

The school's student accident insurance should cover the most reasonable and customary medical expenses. Workers' compensation should cover sponsors/teachers.

Events include but are not limited to art, math, music, speech, and spelling events.

Organization of the ACSI Spelling Bee

The best spellers from a **School Spelling Bee** will advance to a **Local Spelling Bee**. The top five (5) winners of the Grades 5-8 Spell-Off at the Local Bee will be invited to participate in a **Divisional Spelling Bee**. From each Divisional Spelling Bee, the top five (5) winners will then be invited to the **National Spelling Bee**. Here are the details for each of the Spelling Bee components:

School Spelling Bee

The School Spelling Bee should be scheduled approximately six weeks before the ACSI Local Spelling Bee. This timing allows for the *School Participation Form* (page 27) to be emailed to the Chairperson 30 days before the event.

To conduct your School Spelling Bee, follow the ACSI *Procedures and Rules* (refer to pages 10-11) to determine each grade's best speller(s). A maximum of four (4) students per grade can participate in the ACSI Local Spelling Bee. It is recommended to identify alternate spellers if any selected students cannot attend the event. Schools can use the ACSI *Student Practice List* or create word lists and sentences for each grade level Bee.

Once you have chosen the participants from your school, assign a coach to work with these spellers. The coach should meet with the students at least once a week for practice. They should hold mock Bees and train the spellers to use the say-spell-say procedure (refer to the *Procedures and Rules* on pages 10-11). The coach should also review the *Procedures and Rules* with the students and ensure that they are followed during practice

Local Spelling Bee

Local Spelling Bees may be held for Grades 1-4 only, Grades 5-8 only, or Grades 1-8.

The ACSI Local Spelling Bee is divided into two levels:

- Grades 1–4: Spellers participate in grade-level competition.
- **Grades 5–8:** Spellers participate in grade-level competition. The first, second, third, and fourth-place grade-level finishers advance to a Spell-Off competition.

Each grade level Bee will take place in a separate room. The Chairperson may determine the sequence in which participants spell before the Bee or on the day of the Bee.

The Local Spelling Bee will be conducted according to the ACSI *Procedures and Rules*. The first round of words will serve as a practice round. Students will not be eliminated for misspelling a word during this round. After the practice round, students will be eliminated in subsequent rounds to determine the top spellers.

Awards may be presented at an Awards Assembly or in grade-level Bee rooms after completing the competition.

Divisional Spelling Bee

The top five (5) winners of the Grades 5-8 Spell-Off at the Local Bee will be invited to participate in a Divisional Spelling Bee.

The Divisional Spelling Bee will be conducted according to the ACSI *Procedures and Rules*. The first round of words will serve as a practice round. Students will not be eliminated for misspelling a word during this round. After the practice round, students will be eliminated in subsequent rounds to determine the top spellers.

National Spelling Bee

From each Divisional Spelling Bee, the top five (5) winners will then be invited to the National Spelling Bee.

The National Spelling Bee will be conducted according to the ACSI *Procedures and Rules*. The first round of words will serve as a practice round. Students will not be eliminated for misspelling a word during this round. After the practice round, students will be eliminated in subsequent rounds to determine the top spellers.

Spelling Bee Officials

Each participating school must provide five (5) adult volunteers to officiate at the Local Spelling Bee. Fill out the *Volunteer Submission Form* (page 28) and email it to the event Chairperson 30 days before the Local Spelling Bee or by the Chairperson's deadline. A fillable form can be downloaded from the "Spelling Bee Resources" page at acsi.org/studentleadership.

Adult workers are needed to fill the positions of **Spell Master**, **Head Judge**, **Recording Judge**, **Arbitrator**, and **Round Keeper**. Note: Parents are not permitted to work in the same room where their child competes in the Bee.

Important: When recommending someone as a Spell Master, ensure they have a background in English or are proficient in this area. Additionally, they should possess excellent articulation and pronunciation skills. To maintain fairness for all students, the Spell Master must not have an accent or dialect that differs from the geographical area of the Spelling Bee.

The Chairperson will email each volunteer worker a specific job assignment and a Spelling Bee Volunteer Packet before the Spelling Bee. Each worker must attend an orientation meeting approximately one hour before the Spelling Bee begins. Please remember that the orientation meeting cannot start until all judges arrive.

Job Descriptions

Spell Master (Judge A)

Refer to the Sample Spelling Bee Script on pages 17-20.

- Initiate the Bee with one practice round. (There is no elimination during the practice round.)
 - Grades 1-4 only: The Spell Master may give a second round of practice words to "erase the jitters" before the start of the Bee. The second practice round must be explained before starting that round.
- · Pronounce the word to be spelled and automatically give a sentence. Address it to the contestant.
- Listen as the contestant spells, and kindly communicate whether they can continue in the Bee. (Example response:
 "That is correct" or "I'm sorry. That is incorrect. The correct spelling is _____. Please report to the Round Keeper.")
- Be prepared to give any re-pronunciation or definition to aid the contestant's understanding of the word. The Spell Master may not provide the part of speech or the root word if requested by the speller. The speller may ask, "Is the word a _____?" or "Is the root word _____?" The Spell Master may answer "yes" or "no." Contestants must request all aid; do not volunteer the information. Exception: The Spell Master will automatically give a sentence after the word to be spelled has been pronounced.
- The judging panel may decide when the word has had ample clarification. You should then instruct the contestant to say the word and begin spelling.
- If the Spell Master is unsure of a word's pronunciation or cannot pronounce it according to the provided dictionary
 pronunciation, the word should be skipped. A notation should be made in the Spell Master's word list indicating
 that the word was not used in the Bee. It is appropriate to consult with the Head Judge when making this decision.
- The Spell Master will address the contestant after another judge has informed the judging panel that a contestant has been eliminated due to a rule infraction.
- If two rounds pass without eliminating students, the Round Keeper will inform the Spell Master. The Spell Master can then decide whether to advance to the next level of difficulty.

Head Judge (Judge B)

- · Assist the Spell Master in any way possible to keep the Bee running efficiently.
- Stop the student if they do not pronounce the word or if they do not pronounce it correctly. Watch for procedure infractions, etc. If the contestant fails to pronounce the word correctly, the Head Judge may stop the student and say, "I'm sorry, you are mispronouncing the word. Please listen as the Spell Master repeats the word." (The Spell Master may also do this).
- · Operate the stopwatch.
 - Time begins immediately after the word is clarified (if requested) and the speller pronounces (or is advised to pronounce) the word. The contestant has 30 seconds to begin spelling. If the speller has not started within 30 seconds, say, "Time. You must complete the spelling of the word in the next 30 seconds. Please begin."
 - If the contestant does not finish spelling the word in these 30 seconds, say "Time. I'm sorry, too much time has elapsed." (The Spell Master then directs the contestant to report to the Round Keeper.)

Recording Judge (Judge C)

- Use a pencil and notepad to write each letter as the contestant spells. This is necessary for the retracing rule.
- If the contestant stops spelling and starts over, you must check the letter sequence you wrote down and ensure no changes were made.
- If the letter sequence was changed during the retracing, say to the judging panel, "I'm sorry, the letters were changed during retracing." The Spell Master will notify the contestant of their elimination from the Spelling Bee.
- A second Recording Judge may be used if a recording device is unavailable.

Arbitrator (Judge D)

- · Resolve questions or conflicts regarding rules or procedures.
- Pay close attention to every aspect of the contestant's participation, as a protest could be filed at any time for many different reasons.
- Operate the recording device and have access to the official ACSI dictionary. The Arbitrator should have a word list available, but it should never be within reading range of the speller in progress.
- Assist the Spell Master by looking up words in the dictionary for additional clarification when requested by the
 contestant. Keep the dictionary out of the speller's view. The portion of the dictionary you are looking at can be a
 clue to the word's first letter.

Round Keeper (Judge E)

- · Keep a record of the rounds.
 - Use a flip chart or cards with separate numbers on each sheet.
 - Watch the order of contestants. When a contestant is ready to spell again, a round has been completed.
 - Pay close attention to who begins each round, as it may change due to the elimination of the previous "first" contestant.
- Log the correct or misspelled spelling for each speller on the Record Keeping Form.
 - Write the name of each speller, their assigned number, and their school in the appropriate spaces on the form.
 - Enter a round number at the top of each column.
 - Mark C for correct spelling and M for misspelling for each participant in each round.
- Inform the Spell Master if two rounds pass without any eliminations.

Host (Optional)

Note: If a separate Host is not assigned, any Spelling Bee Official may assume the Host's responsibilities.

- Attend the Worker's Orientation Meeting and meet with grade-level volunteers before the Opening Assembly.
- Attend the Opening Assembly and lead spellers to the room where their grade level Bee will occur.
- Seat the spellers in the order they will be spelling (refer to the Record Keeping Form).
- Welcome the spellers and audience members to the Spelling Bee and introduce the judging panel (refer to the Sample Spelling Bee Script).
- Remind the audience members to power off cell phones and other electronic devices.
- Sit near the door and monitor the spellers and audience members. The audience must remain seated until a break to avoid confusing or distracting the spellers.
- · Open the door between the rounds to allow spellers and audience members to leave.
- · Direct spellers and parents to the nearest restrooms.
- At the end of the Spelling Bee, please gather all items used by the judges and the door signs and return them to the check-in table.

Combining Jobs (Optional)

Note: If not enough volunteers are available to fulfill the required roles, one option is to combine the responsibilities of the Recording Judge and Round Keeper or the Head Judge and Arbitrator. This approach ensures that all necessary tasks are carried out efficiently, even with a limited number of volunteers.

Procedures and Rules

All Procedures and Rules must be followed at the ACSI Spelling Bee to preserve the program's credibility.

- Spelling Bee officials include the Spell Master, Head Judge, Recording Judge, Arbitrator, and Round Keeper. The Head Judge will also act as a spokesperson for the judging panel.
- Words will be pronounced according to the diacritical markings in *Merriam-Webster's Collegiate Dictionary, Eleventh Edition*, from which the definition(s) are provided.
- The Spell Master may not give the part of speech or the root word; however, if asked, "Is the word a _____" or "Is the root word ?" the Spell Master may answer "yes" or "no."
- Merriam-Webster's Collegiate Dictionary, Eleventh Edition, is the final authority for the spelling of words. If a word has two or more accepted spellings, only the spellings set in boldface type and separated by the word "or" (and in some cases, the word "also" at the beginning of the descriptive matter) will be considered correct. Spellings labeled as archaic, obsolete (abbreviated as "obs"), and regional (such as North, Midland, South, British, and Irish) that differ from those in boldface type will not be accepted as correct.
- The Spell Master will initiate the Spelling Bee with one practice round. Students may misspell a word only during the practice round and continue in the contest.
- For each word, the Spell Master will pronounce the word, give a sentence for clarification, and repeat the word.
- · The speller must do the following:
 - Look at the Spell Master/judging panel.
 - Say the word before spelling. (This is to ensure that the student heard the word correctly.)
 - Spell the word orally. (Students will not be permitted to trace the words on their body or in the air.)
 - Say the word again after it is spelled to indicate spelling is complete.
 - This is the "say-spell-say" procedure that must be followed to ensure that (1) the speller understands the correct pronunciation of the word, and (2) the judges know when the spelling is complete and that no letters will be added. The Head Judge will stop the student if they fail to pronounce the word before spelling it or if it is mispronounced. Failure to say-spell-say will not eliminate the speller from competition, but it will reduce the chances of correct spelling and/or the ability to arbitrate. It may cause the speller to exceed 60 seconds.
 - Spellers must speak clearly and loudly. The judges' decision is final in determining the correctness of the spelling, which may be misunderstood if not spoken clearly.
 - Spellers are allowed to ask for a definition of the word for clarification before beginning to spell or ask for the definition, sentence, and/or pronunciation to be repeated. Requests will be granted until the judges agree that the word has been made reasonably clear to the speller. If a student takes advantage of the rule, they will be advised by the Spell Master to say the word and begin spelling.
- After the student spells the word:
 - If spelled correctly, the student returns to their seat, and the student in the waiting area moves up to the
 microphone or the spot marked for the speller. As this occurs, the next student approaches the waiting area.
 - If misspelled (or eliminated by rules infraction), the student goes directly to the Round Keeper (or to the Arbitrator if there is a protest regarding the judges' decision).
 - When a student has been eliminated from a round, the next speller moves up to take the vacated seat, thus keeping spellers sitting together and in order.
- After clarification (if requested) and once the student pronounces (or is advised to pronounce) the word, they have 30 seconds to begin spelling. If the student does not start spelling at the end of the 30 seconds, the judges will remind them to begin. The student then has another 30 seconds to complete spelling the word from the time the judges give the reminder. If the student fails to spell the word by the end of these 30 seconds, they will be disqualified. The speller will then report to the Round Keeper.
- A speller may stop and start over, retracing the spelling from the beginning after having started to spell a word. However, letters and their sequence must be the same as those first pronounced in the retracing. If a speller changes letters or their sequence during the retracing, they will be disqualified.
- To ensure clarity and prevent misunderstandings, the student must verbally indicate when they are starting over.

Procedures and Rules (continued)

- When a word is misspelled, the Spell Master will say, "I'm sorry, that is incorrect," then correctly spell the word for the speller and give the next word to the next speller.
- · After being eliminated, every speller must report to the Round Keeper.
- Any questions related to the spelling of a word should be referred to the Arbitrator immediately.

In any instance, the speller, parent, or coach are the only individuals permitted to protest on behalf of the speller they represent. The deadline for making a protest is before the affected speller would have received their next word if they had remained in the contest. No protest will be entertained after that word has been given to another speller. When only two spellers remain, a protest must be made immediately before the second speller starts spelling their given word. After protesting, the speller, parent, or coach must move back 15 feet to allow the judges to deliberate. The Head Judge will communicate the final decision to the speller, parent, or coach.

The speller, parent, or coach does not participate in the decision-making process or have access to the judges' dictionary, audio recording, Recording Judge's notepad, etc. If a speller is placed back in the Spelling Bee, the speller will be given a new word to spell for the round and assume their original place if the new word is spelled correctly.

- The Arbitrator will have access to the word lists, pronunciations, definitions, sentences, the official Bee dictionary, the audio recording of the Bee, the rules, and the timekeeper's record sheet. If a challenge cannot be resolved from one of the above resources, the Arbitrator will call for a brief time-out to confer with the judges. The judges' decision is final.
- If only one of the spellers remaining in the contest at the start of a round spells a word correctly during that round, the speller shall be given an opportunity to spell the next word on the list. If the speller correctly spells the new word, the speller shall be declared the champion. Otherwise, all the spellers remaining at the start of the round shall stay in the competition. A new round will begin, with all the spellers spelling in their original order.

After the champion is declared, a tiebreaker will take place if there is a tie for 2nd, 3rd, or 4th place.

Tie Breaker: When multiple spellers are eliminated in the same round, they are tied for the same place. Once the champion has been determined, Spelling Bee officials will hold tiebreakers if there is a tie for 2nd, 3rd, or 4th place. Tiebreakers are necessary to award prizes and decide which spellers qualify for the next level of competition. Each student will be given two words to spell consecutively during the tiebreaker. The speller will spell two words before the next speller is given their turn. The speller who correctly spells the most words will be awarded the higher place. If two or more students spell the same number of words correctly, the judges will give each student two additional words to spell consecutively.

- The ACSI Spelling Bee panel of judges will have complete control over the Bee, and their decisions are final.
- Merriam-Webster's Collegiate Dictionary, Eleventh Edition may be referenced during the Spelling Bee. All word lists, writing tablets, laptops, smartphones, recording devices, pens, pencils, etc., must be put away during the Spelling Bee.
- No one other than the Recording Judge can record the competition. Recording includes audio recording, video recording, and written recording.
- Each participating school may have one coach in the room to represent their students in the Spelling Bee. The coach can be either a school representative or a parent.
- · Please do not approach the judges or the spellers during the break times.
- No talking will be allowed among spellers or between spellers and audience members. If a speller receives assistance
 from anyone in the audience, they will be disqualified. Spellers found talking may be disqualified.
- If a speller, parent, or coach is found in possession of an ACSI word list other than the current year's *Student Practice List* at any ACSI Spelling Bee, the speller may be disqualified.

Spelling Bee Scenarios and Descriptions

Five scenarios have been developed to demonstrate the progress and elimination of spellers using the official ACSI Spelling Bee *Procedures and Rules*.

The scenarios were developed using a panel of 8 to 11 contestants. At this point in a Spelling Bee, the Bee officials would closely track contestants' elimination. Eight spellers represent the potential top eight places.

Each scenario demonstrates the progression through the rounds until the champion is determined. Once the champion is determined, any necessary tiebreaker rounds are conducted. It is important to note that all spellers eliminated in the same round are tied for the same place.

Each scenario demonstrates one or more potential circumstances that can be encountered in the ACSI Spelling Bee.

- 1. All spellers misspell in round 12. They all move forward to round 13.
- 2. The champion is determined in round 14.
- 3. A tiebreaker for second and third places is conducted, with spellers eliminated in round 13.
- 4. A tiebreaker for fourth place is conducted, with spellers eliminated in round 11.
- For the grades 5-8 Spell-Off only, tiebreakers should also be conducted to determine 5th, 6th, and 7th places.

Sample Spelling Bee Script

The following script is designed to help Spelling Bee officials understand their roles in running the Spelling Bee. It will be most helpful to first-time Spell Masters.

Please read through the script, making any adjustments appropriate to your Bee. The script is provided as a general guide for all ACSI Spelling Bees across the country. As such, it reflects the published rules and guidelines of the Bee but may not account for "housekeeping details" unique to your host school/region.

Script for Grade-Level Spelling Bees

The Spelling Bee officials should arrive in their assigned room before the students. This will allow them time to prepare themselves and set up the materials for the Bee.

As students arrive in their assigned room, the Host or other officials will direct them to sit in the area designated for spellers. The sequence spellers will spell may be determined by students drawing numbers or by the Chairperson before the Bee.

Merriam-Webster's Collegiate Dictionary, Eleventh Edition may be used during the Spelling Bee, but all word lists, writing tablets, laptops, smartphones, recording devices, pens, pencils, etc., are to be put away during the Spelling Bee. Remember that if you have any questions regarding the procedures of the Bee or the reason your student was disqualified, you may ask the Arbitrator. Every effort will be made to answer your question.



Legend:

- **A Spell Master** (Gives the contestant the word.)
- **B Head Judge** (Stops the contestant if they forget to pronounce or mispronounce the word; operates the stopwatch.)
- C Recording Judge (Records each letter and checks retracing.)
- **D Arbitrator Judge** (Operates the recording device and arbitrates disputes.)
- **E Round Keeper** (Manages the round chart and records disqualified contestants.)
- **F Additional Recording Judge** (Needed only if a recording device is unavailable *optional*.)
- O Microphones (optional)
- X1 Speller (in process)
- X2 Speller (next up)

To minimize distractions or signals from the audience, students should avoid facing the audience unless the house lights can be significantly dimmed. The audience seating area may be located to the side or behind the spellers, depending on the available space in the room. Students must maintain their total concentration on the Spell Master and other Spelling Bee officials throughout the entire Bee without any interruptions.


