A1	Early Signs of Dyslexia & Helpful Interventions	Dyslexia is a language-based learning disability, BUT it is one that can be remedied with the right dose of love, encouragement, and effective strategies. Participants will learn the early warning signs and what to look for during early childhood. We'll learn WHY and HOW to help those students who are also struggling to formulate their expressive language. Dyslexia is lifelong, meaning that these kids need tools to place in their tool belts so that they can successfully recognize letters, sounds, and patterns, and read simple sentences.
