


Next, segment your donor base thoughtfully. Identify major supporters, loyal families, alumni, and grandparents—and consider how you will engage each group differently.

Development is most effective when stewardship and cultivation are personalized, not one-size-fits-all.

Finally, map your calendar with relational moments, not just events but opportunities for intentional, tailored cultivation. Where will donors see the mission in action? How will you connect their generosity to visible outcomes in the life of your school?

Fundraising is not a seasonal task—it's a year-round ministry. By using this summer margin to plan with clarity and purpose, you set the stage for a year of deeper relationships, greater generosity, and a stronger community united around your school's mission.
