



## Message from your Regional Director

Fellow International Christian Educator,

International educators have travel stories, I have them, so do you. I will never forget the time I landed at Narita in Tokyo to make a connection to serve an ACSI school in SE Asia. We were informed just prior to landing that all outbound flights were cancelled due to a snowstorm. I gave a sigh, but thought, "No problem, I will just go to a nearby hotel, get some sleep and catch a connection the next day." Once in the terminal I learned that there was no ground transportation, and all hotels were full. After walking around the crowded terminal for a couple of hours trying everything I could think of, it finally sunk in that I was going nowhere along with thousands of other stranded travelers. And so, eventually I accepted the airport handouts: a blanket, a foil pack of crackers and a small drink box. Then found a little spot of floor and laid down next to my many new neighbors to try and get some rest. With my head on my backpack and my body on the cold marble floor, I couldn't help but be reminded of that time when Jesus remarked, "*Foxes have holes, and birds of the air have nests, but the Son of Man has nowhere to lay his head.*" (Matthew 8:20)

Jesus said those words to an excited scribe that came up to him and declared, "Teacher, I will follow you wherever you go." In his response Jesus was basically warning the scribe that following him would be costly. Now, I do not equate my one night on an airport floor as anywhere near the costly discipleship that Jesus was talking about. But as I laid there that evening, I had to do some soul checking about what's most important, about the true cost of following Jesus, about my selfish wants, and about my need to be in control. While listening to the sounds of babies crying, adults snoring, and a few neighbors chatting, I felt comforted knowing that Jesus knew right where I was, that he knew all about not having a place to lay one's head, and that it was going to be ok. He was there with me.

What's your travel story? Have you seen Jesus meet you in unexpected ways? Are you resting in your Savior's care today despite challenges you don't want and didn't ask for? Are you taking your questions to Him, letting go of your need for control, and resting in Him? Go ahead and share your best travel story with a colleague/friend and be sure to ask for theirs. And oh, btw, I did make the connection the next day.




