

Statement of Practice for Non-licensed EE Programs



High quality accredited Christian early education programs engage in practices that are systematic, address all ages and domains of child development, and are biblically integrated. Regardless of the licensing status of the EE program, the goal is to provide age-specific learning opportunities in an environment that is safe and healthy, both physically and emotionally, for the children and families served.

A comprehensive approach to high quality programming includes having knowledge of the licensing standards of the state in which the school operates, as well as awareness of National Health and Safety standards. Together, these standards form the basis for operational awareness for all early education programs.

Even if a state does not require Christian/private EE programs to be licensed, non-licensed EE programs that are accredited by ACSI must ensure that they meet (or exceed) the requirements set forth for licensing. A non-licensed EE program that is accredited by ACSI must have a systematic plan to self-monitor their compliance with, or exceeding of, requirements for state licensing. This monitoring process should include participation from EE leadership and staff, head of school, and governance members so that a continuous plan for school improvement is in place. The self-monitoring process should be done at regular intervals to ensure ongoing alignment. ACSI accredited EE programs must communicate their licensing status to potential, new, and existing families, as well as to staff. Publication of licensing/exempt status should be done in compliance with state and local laws. Self-monitoring plan should include (at minimum) alignment with requirements for ratios, staffing, education levels, facility and operational safety, and local ordinances.

Highly effective early education programs, regardless of licensing status, provide evidence of their commitment to create healthy learning environments that help children grow physically, socially, emotionally, academically, and spiritually, addressing the minimum requirements set forth in state licensing in these developmental domains.

ACSI allows for accreditation of non-licensed programs, but schools must certify that they are aware of the state requirements. Granting of ACSI accreditation in no way implies that an EE program/school is in compliance with state and county regulations and expectations for early education.
